# 4CCF recognizes scholarship recipients

In May, Four County Community Foundation celebrated 2023 scholarship recipients and their accomplishments at a luncheon held at The Bells Event Center in Almont.

Kathy Dickens, the Foundation's Executive Director, said the event is a chance for donors and scholarship recipients to connect.

She noted that the Foundation is fortunate to have many scholarship fund founders who've declared they want to "pay it forward forever" and are investing in the future of local graduates, some of whom they may never meet.

In 2023, Four County Community Foundation granted more than \$326,000 in scholarship dollars to students from our service area who are bound for colleges, universities and trade schools.

### New equestrian fund created

Harness Your Equestrian Experience, a field of interest fund, was recently established with Four County Community Foundation by Leon and Anne LaBrecque. The goal of the Harnessing Your Equestrian Experience fund is to make equestrian sports accessible to more people, particularly local youth.

The LaBrecques foresee working with high school and college level equestrian teams, 4-H clubs and organizations that connects kids with horses. Projects could range from covering the costs of supplies and other horse care necessities to excursions or veterinary science learning opportunities. The couple also plans to host fundraisers to benefit the Harnessing Your Equestrian Experience Fund to include all disciplines from English to Western. Additionally, they look forward to collaborating with other equestrian enthusiasts, including local trainers, to spark interest in the fund's efforts.

### Work to begin on Hana's Garden

Despite the threat of rain, a large crowd turned out to mark the ground breaking for Hana's Garden at Oxford Township's Seymour Lake Township Park on August 6. Hana's Garden is the first project of the Hana St. Juliana Memorial Fund and will honor the memory of Hana and the other three victims of the Oxford High School shooting —Madisyn Baldwin, Tate Myre and Justin Shilling. The space will include a water feature, a variety of unique and native plants—many in Hana's favorite color, purple—and a tree sculpture with four rings representing each of the teens. Work is expected to start this fall and the garden should open to the public in the spring of 2024.

### Hospice group establishes agency fund

In June, Four County Community Foundation announced the establishment of a new agency fund—Hospice Homes of Genesee and Lapeer Counties.

As their name suggests, Hospice Home volunteers are committed to creating a guest home where Genesee and Lapeer County residents can live out their last days, instead of a hospital.



At present group founder Diane Welker and fellow board members are collecting donations and hosting fundraisers with the hopes of securing a facility for purchase or rent. They plan to host no more than five patients at a time and need a space that will allow for the usage of medical equipment, particularly stretchers or gurneys. Individuals of the guest home won't be charged and will have their choice from more than a dozen area hospice agencies for care. The home will be staffed by caregivers and volunteers who will be focused on caring for both the individual and their families. Priority will be given to those considered in the greatest need of care.
