Richmond Rotary - Robert "Tiger" Fruin Memorial (HS Seniors)

A Richmond High School senior who has actively participated in community service throughout high school, and who plans to continue their education at an accredited college or university. The scholarship is a fouryear award, renewed annually with the Foundation. Award amount \$2000 x 4 years.

Shelby Community Endowment Scholarship

High School seniors residing in Shelby Township who are planning to attend vocational program, community college, or university. Award amount: \$1000

Jameson Bates Memorial Scholarship (HS Seniors)

High School seniors residing in Shelby Township who are planning to pursue a degree in a medical field. Award amount: \$1000

Kiwanis Club of Macomb (HS and PHS)

Awarded annually to graduating seniors and current college students residing in Macomb Township *and / or* graduating seniors or recent graduates of one of the following: Dakota High School, L'Anse Creuse High School - North, or Lutheran High School North. Ideal applicants consistently demonstrate service to the school and community. Students are eligible to receive up to four awards. Essay response. Financial need is a consideration.

Knights of Columbus #7018 St. Clement of Rome Church College Scholarship (HS and PHS)

Area high school seniors and recent graduates who actively participate in the St. Clement of Rome Parish (Romeo, MI) throughout high school. Students are eligible to receive up to four awards. Essay response. Award amount: \$500

Michigan Professional Insurance Agents Scholarship (MIPIA) (HS and PHS)

High school seniors and recent graduates throughout the State of Michigan who are planning to major in Insurance/Risk Management. Students are eligible to receive up to four awards Essay response. Award amount: \$1000 - \$2000

NMSC Sporting Michigan Soccer Scholarship (HS Seniors)

High school seniors who are active members of the Sporting Michigan Soccer Club. Award amount: \$1000

Detroit Sportsmen's Congress Scholarship

High school seniors and recent graduates who are junior members of the DSC and/or the children or grandchildren of voting members in good standing with a minimum of two years membership in the DSC. Two essays. Applicant appraisal. Award amount: \$1000-\$2000



Attention Blue Water Middle College, STEMM Academy, Early/Middle College, and dual enrollment students: DO NOT apply for Four County Community Foundation scholarships until the year you require tuition payments.

To apply:

After December 1, visit <u>www.4ccf.org/scholarships</u> and set up an account. Complete instructions for using the online platform are available on the scholarship page. If you experience any problems, email <u>program@4ccf.org</u> and I will contact you.

- FIRST VISIT: Click on Register. Select the role of "Student." Enter your first and last name. Enter a <u>permanent email address</u> and a password. Create User.
- SUBSEQUENT VISITS: After the initial registration, you will sign in with your email and password.

NOTE: All communications (including payment requirements) will be sent to the email address that you provide when you register your account. Use a permanent email address that you check regularly, not your high school email address. All follow-up documents will be sent to your registered email account.

Essay Response: (Your Story) All 4CCF scholarship applications require students to share their story in a narrative form using complete sentences and paragraphs. Your Story enables review committees to learn more about you. Sharing details about yourself provides the committee with a sense of who you are, how you spend your time, what your circumstances are like, and how Postsecondary Education opportunities support your life goals. Start thinking and writing about the following:

- *Majors:* Some scholarships are only offered when pursuing specific majors. Choose up to 3 majors.
- Activities and Achievements: academic groups, extracurricular clubs, music, athletics. Include leadership roles and awards
- *Community Involvement*: Ways in which you interact and impact your community. Include community service and volunteerism through scouting, church groups, etc.
- *Special Concerns*: Include any circumstances that present difficulty, such as financial hardship, learning challenges, family challenges, health challenges, obstacles and adversity.
- Goals and Future Plans: Include ways a scholarship award will help you achieve your goals.

If you are awarded a scholarship

If you are awarded a scholarship from Four County Community Foundation, you will receive information at your senior awards ceremony in May. You are required to complete and return the *Grant Agreement* to us, along with proof of enrollment, such as an invoice or class schedule. Most students send the Grant Agreement and proof of enrollment to the Foundation in AUGUST, as soon as they have their class schedule or an invoice for the Fall semester. Keep track of your documents. If you lose something, email the office for a new one.

When I receive the two documents, a check will be sent directly to your college or university. The college will apply the scholarship to your account in two payments, for the Fall and Winter semesters.

If your plans change

If your plans change and you do not need to use your scholarship award for the Fall Semester, contact me as soon as possible. The Foundation is willing to hold your award for the second semester, or even the following year, <u>but you must email the Foundation to explain your plan for using the funds</u>.
