<b>April Millsap Memorial Scholarship (HS Seniors)</b>
Armada High School seniors pursuing any major or coursework after graduation. <b>Award amount:</b> \$500
<b>Cryderman - Hebblewhite Agriculture Scholarship (CHAF) (HS and PHS)</b>
Armada seniors and recent graduates pursuing a degree in <b>any agriculture-related field</b> , including food science, conservation, veterinary medicine, etc. Students are eligible to receive up to four awards. <b>Award amount:</b> \$1000 - \$2000
<b>Victoria E. Hill Memorial Scholarship (HS and PHS)</b>
Open to Armada seniors and recent graduates, with a GPA of 2.5 or greater, planning to major in <b>elementary or secondary education</b> . Students are eligible to receive up to two awards. <b>Award amount:</b> \$1000 - \$2000
<b>Ruth Isaacson Memorial Scholarship (HS Seniors)</b>
Armada High School seniors who have demonstrated service to their community and are pursuing any major or course of study. <b>Award amount:</b> \$500
<b>William &amp; Betty Morrison Memorial Scholarship (HS Seniors)</b>
Armada High School seniors who have demonstrated service to their community and school and are pursuing any major or course of study. <b>Award amount:</b> \$1000
<b>James A. Neely Scholarship (HS Seniors)</b>
Armada High School seniors who have been selected as members of the Macomb County All-Academic Team. <b>Award amount:</b> \$750 - \$1500
<b>The Pond Guy Scholarship (Armada Seniors)</b>
Armada High School seniors and children or grandchildren of The Pond Guy employees and current employees at The Pond Guy pursuing any kind of post-secondary education. GPA of 3.5 or higher. <b>Award amount:</b> \$1500
<b>Michigan Professional Insurance Agents Scholarship (MIPIA) (HS and PHS)</b>
Open to high school seniors and recent graduates throughout the State of Michigan who are planning to major in <b>Insurance/Risk Management</b> . Students are eligible to receive up to four awards <b>Award amount:</b> \$1000 - \$2000
<b>Russell W. Ligon Memorial Engineering (HS and PHS)</b>
Seniors and recent graduates in seven school districts planning to major in <b>engineering or computer science</b> and have a 3.00 or greater GPA. A letter of recommendation is required. Students are eligible to receive up to four awards. <b>Award amount:</b> \$500-\$1000
<b>George S. Souten Performing Arts Scholarship (HS Seniors)</b>
Armada, Capac, Imlay City, and Romeo high school seniors who are planning to major and/or minor in <b>performing arts</b> . Strong performing arts background throughout high school. <b>Award amount:</b> \$1000
<b>Vera Souten Medical Field Scholarship (HS Seniors)</b>
Armada, Capac, Imlay City, and Romeo high school seniors who are planning to major in a <b>medical field</b> . <b>Award amount:</b> \$1000
<b>Leadership in Philanthropy Scholarship (HS Seniors)</b>
Area high school seniors who have actively participated in <b>4CCF Youth Advisory Committee</b> for two or more years. <b>Award amount:</b> \$500 - \$2500
<b>Knights of Columbus #7018 St. Clement of Rome Church College Scholarship (HS and PHS)</b>
Area high school seniors / recent graduates who actively participate in the <b>St. Clement of Rome Parish</b> (Romeo, MI) throughout high school and are pursuing any major. <b>Award amount:</b> \$500
<b>Kiwanis Club of Macomb (HS and PHS)</b>
For AHS seniors who reside in Macomb Township and demonstrate service to the community. Students are eligible to receive up to four awards. <b>Award amount:</b> \$1000

**Attention early/middle college, and dual enrollment students: DO NOT apply for Four County Community Foundation scholarships until the year you require tuition payments.**

**To apply:**

After December 1, visit [www.4ccf.org/scholarships/apply](http://www.4ccf.org/scholarships/apply) and set up an account. Complete instructions for using the online platform are available on the scholarship page. - **FIRST VISIT:** Click on “Create New Account.” Please use a **permanent email address** to create your logon credentials. A tutorial with step-by-step instructions on how to create an account and apply can be found on the portal’s home page.
- **SUBSEQUENT VISITS:** After the initial registration, you will sign in with your email and password.

**NOTE:** All communications will be sent to the email address that you provide when you register your account. **Use a permanent email address** that you check regularly, not your high school email address. All follow-up documents will be sent to your registered email account.

**Essay Response:** All 4CCF scholarship applications require students to share their story in a narrative form using complete sentences and paragraphs. Your essay responses enable review committees to learn more about you. Sharing details about yourself provides the committee with a sense of who you are, how you spend your time, what your circumstances are like, and how attending a college or trade school supports your life goals. Start thinking and writing about the following:

- **Majors:** Be prepared to explain why you’re pursuing a particular major or course of study.
- **Activities and Achievements:** Detail your involvement in academic groups, extracurricular clubs, music, athletics and include information about leadership roles you’ve held and awards you’ve received.
- **Community Involvement:** Describe the ways in which you interact and impact your community through community service and volunteerism either individually or as a member of a group.
- **Special Concerns:** You have an opportunity to explain any difficult circumstances in your life, such as financial hardship, learning challenges, family issues, health concerns, obstacles and adversity.
- **Goals and Future Plans:** List the ways a scholarship award will help you achieve your goals.

**Other information you’ll need when applying**

- **Academic Information:** Your cumulative GPA, an unofficial transcript, your ACT/SAT scores if you took either test
- **Financial Information:** FAFSA Student Aid Index (SAI) report or a document stating why you did not complete a FAFSA form; the number of other scholarships you’ve applied for; the total value of other scholarships you have already received
